Funding

- **Purpose of Funding:** Mitigate the impact of "uncertainty and ripple effect of the coronavirus (COVID-19) on institutions of higher education, staff faculty, students, and parents

Note: Schools have one year from the date their most recent grant obligation was processed by ED to spend all of their HEERF funds, including funds from prior rounds of funding from HEERF I and HEERF II, which was on May 11, 2021.

Spending Requirements

- Providing additional emergency financial aid grants to students.
- Providing reimbursements for tuition, housing, room and board, or other fee refunds.
- Providing tuition discounts.
- Covering the cost of providing additional technology hardware to students, such as laptops or tablets, or covering the added cost of technology fees.
- Providing or subsidizing the costs of high-speed internet to students or faculty to transition to an online environment.
- Subsidizing off-campus housing costs due to dormitory closures.
- Subsidizing food service to reduce density in eating facilities.
- Costs related to operating additional class sections to enable social distancing, such as those for hiring more instructors and increasing campus hours of operations.

Spending Requirements (Cont'd)

- Campus safety and operations.
- Purchasing, leasing, or renting additional instructional equipment and supplies (such as laboratory equipment or computers) to reduce the number of students sharing equipment or supplies during a class period and to provide time for disinfection between uses.
- Replacing lost revenue from academic sources.
- Replacing lost revenue from auxiliary services sources (i.e., cancelled ancillary events; disruption of food service, dorms, childcare, or other facilities; cancellation of use of campus venues by other organizations, lost parking revenue, etc.).
- Purchasing faculty and staff training in online instruction; or paying additional funds to staff who are providing training in addition to their regular job responsibilities.
- Purchasing, leasing, or renting additional equipment or software to enable distance learning, or upgrading campus wi-fi access or extending open networks to parking lots or public spaces, etc.
