Examples of Auto-Generated Emails for Referrals

Unfortunately, Starfish is configured in such a way that instructors are unable to see the complete auto-generated email that students receive when their instructor has made a Referral.

See below for examples of the Referral emails as they appear to students, as well as suggestions for ways to customize the language that appears in the comment box (written by the Starfish Implementation Team and the Faculty Focus group).

For all auto-generated emails, the email comes from your email address (as the person who sent it). If a student were to reply to the email, it would go directly to you.

Academic Counseling Center Referral Email:

The subject, salutation, and closing are not editable for the auto-generated email and you will not see them when you make a referral, but the text of the email, all of which you are able to see in the comment box, may be changed in any way you wish. This is the default language for an Academic Counseling Referral:

Please see an Academic Counselor. To make an appointment visit the Academic Counseling Center in the Student Services Building Lobby.

This kind of discussion with your counselor will contribute to your academic and personal success at SBCC and beyond.

The example below, for a student named "Stephanie," includes these added comments: *I am* sending you this referral because of the conversation we had in office hours and It would be best to complete this appointment before August 31, 2017. Please do let me know how it goes, which were simply typed into the comment box and written so that they integrated smoothly with the default comments.
